How do I use this voter guide?

- We have created this comparison chart in order to comply with IRS regulations. All information is provided for reference and education only.
- California Family Council is a non-partisan, non-sectarian, 501(c)3 non-profit ministry and does not endorse or oppose candidates for office.
- Each candidate for State Assembly/Senate, or U.S. House of Representatives/Senate is listed under the office for which they are running.
- California's 17 ballot propositions are also listed below in a special section.
- Each candidate's name is followed by their party affiliation: Republican (R), Democrat (D), Libertarian (L), or None (NA).
- Following their name and party identification are series of numbers (12). Each number represents a different state, local, or national organization or individual that has formally endorsed or publically supported that candidate.
- **Generally, odd-numbered groups purport to be conservative, while even-numbered organizations tend to be progressive/liberal.**
- Positions for these organizations were taken from their respective websites or voter guides. If an organization has publicly endorsed/supported a candidate, their number is listed following the candidate's name. If an organization opposed/took no position on a candidate, their number is absent.
- If a candidate has been deemed unacceptable by California Family Alliance, their name is followed by "Opposed by CFA."
- **Example:** "John Smith (R) 1;5;11" means candidate Smith is running as a Republican (R) and has been endorsed or publically supported by CFA (1), Craig Huey (5), and the HJTA (11). Conversely, NARAL (6) opposed the candidate, and CFT (10) took no position, so neither 6 nor 10 appears.
